

Analyze It!

READ:

Historians understand artifacts (objects made and used by people) by making observations, asking questions and analyzing. This helps them understand how an object works, why it was made, and how it was used. Artifacts help us learn about life in the past and life today. The things you use today to play, do your schoolwork, eat, or communicate will tell people one hundred years from now what it was like to be a young person today.

DO:

- Look at the Coffee Cup Questions sheet for some example questions.
- **Choose** something of yours, maybe, a favorite toy, clothing, or something interesting from the kitchen.
- Ask yourself questions while you look closely. Don't worry about answers yet. Challenge yourself to write or say aloud as many questions as you can about your object. Set a time limit of three minutes. If you are doing the activity with another person, see who comes up with the most questions or work together to make the list as long as possible.
- Pick your favorite question and try to answer it by talking to an adult or going online.
- Analyze It! Use the artifact sheet to draw and write information about your object or a different object. Choose a number between 1 and 10.
 Look at the word sheet and put that word at the top of your sheet, then follow the directions an start analyzing!




Word Generator
