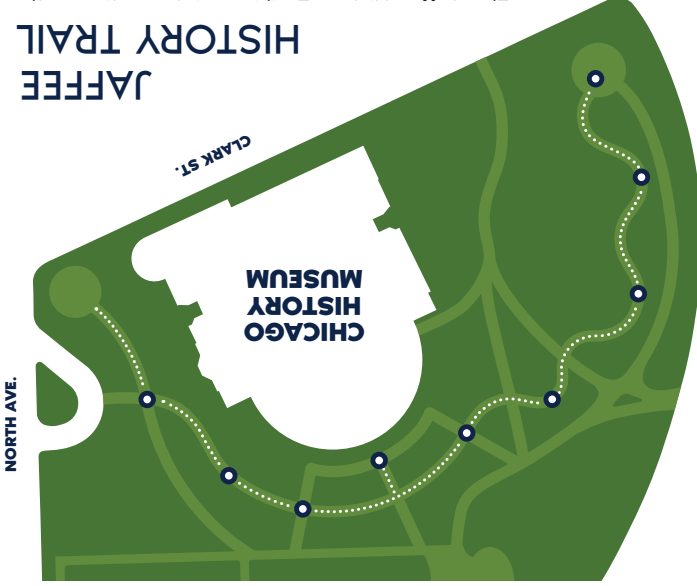
**DO YOU HAVE A RESTAURANT AND A MUSEUM STORE?**

### ★ FACING FREEDOM IN AMERICA

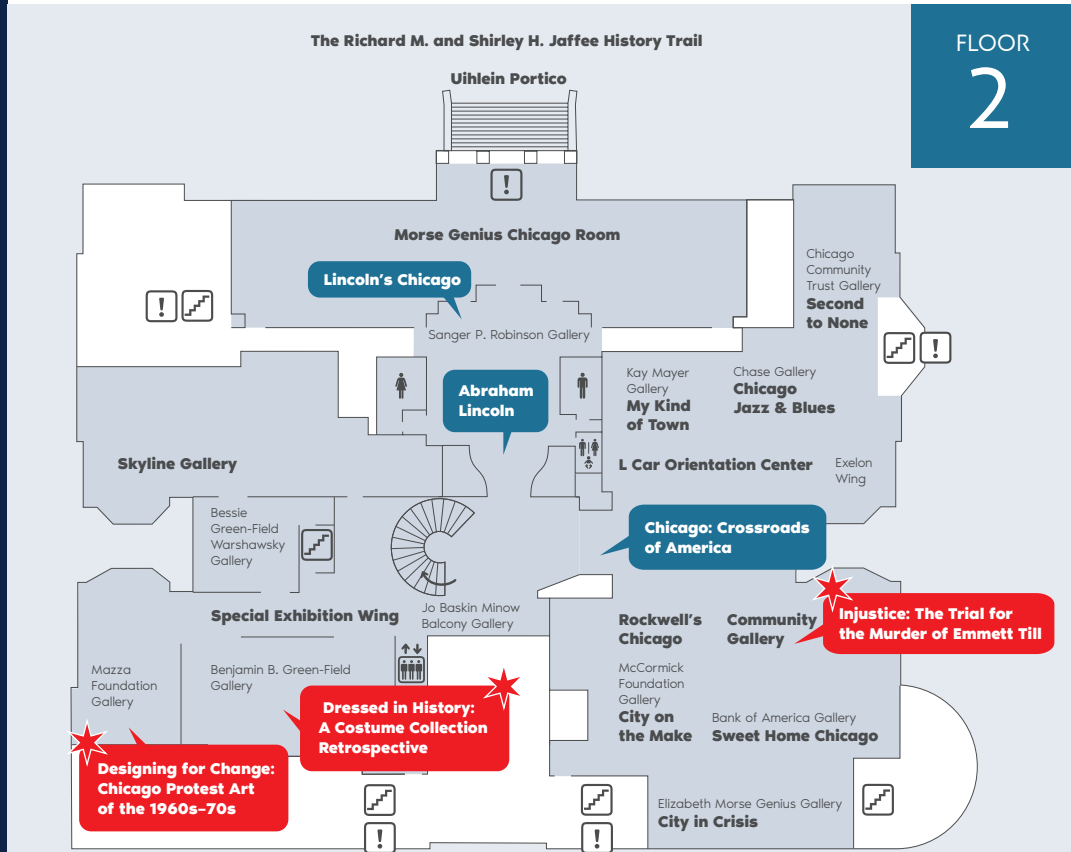

### ★ THE GREAT CHICAGO ADVENTURE

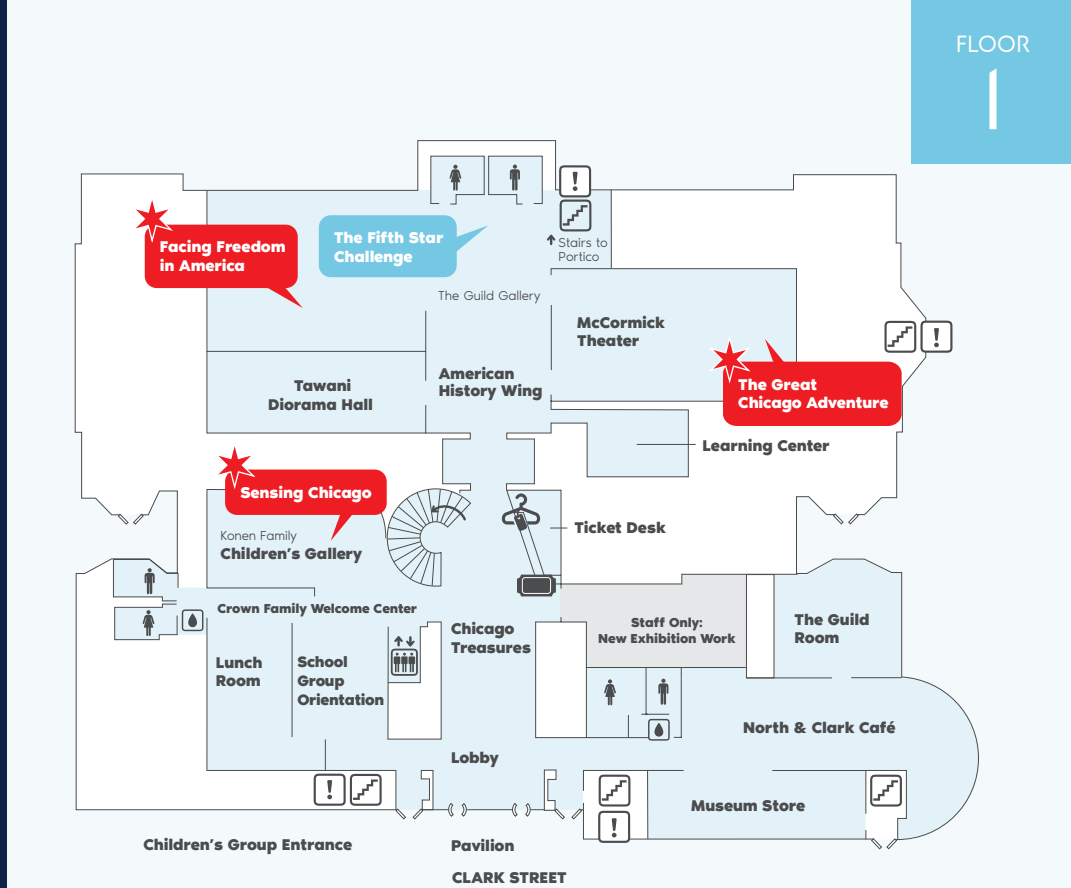
