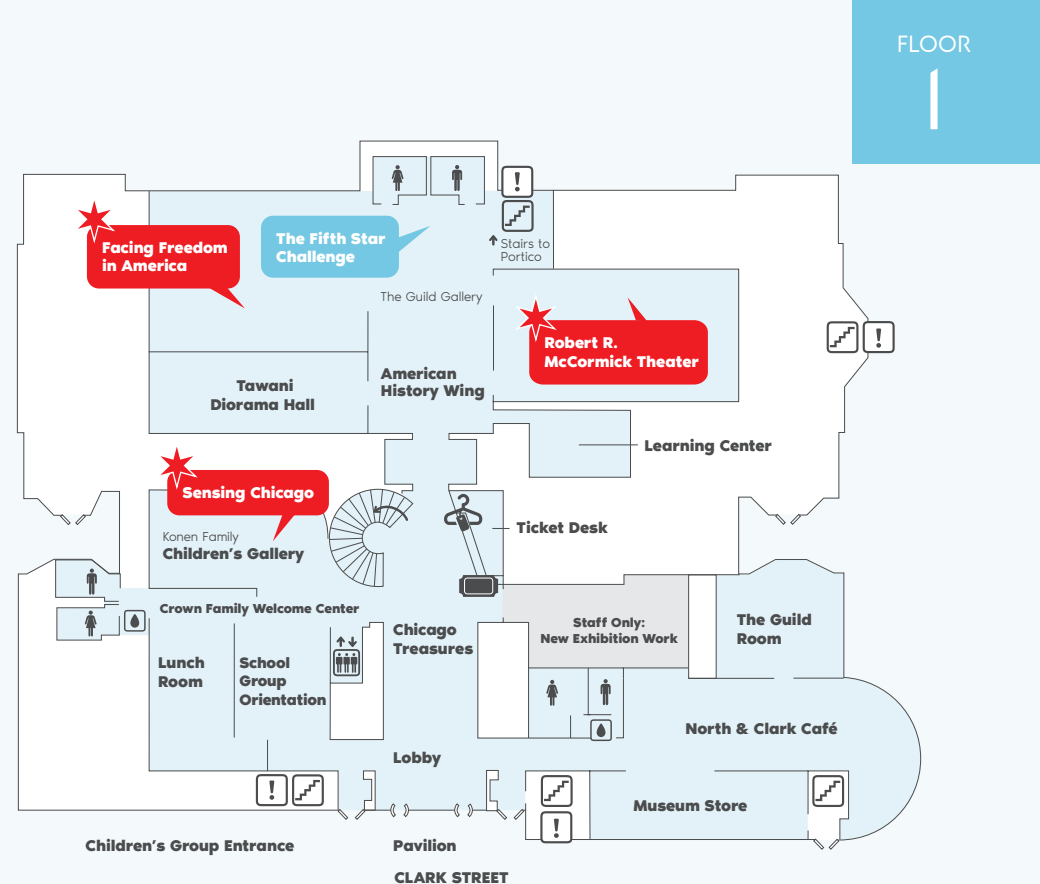
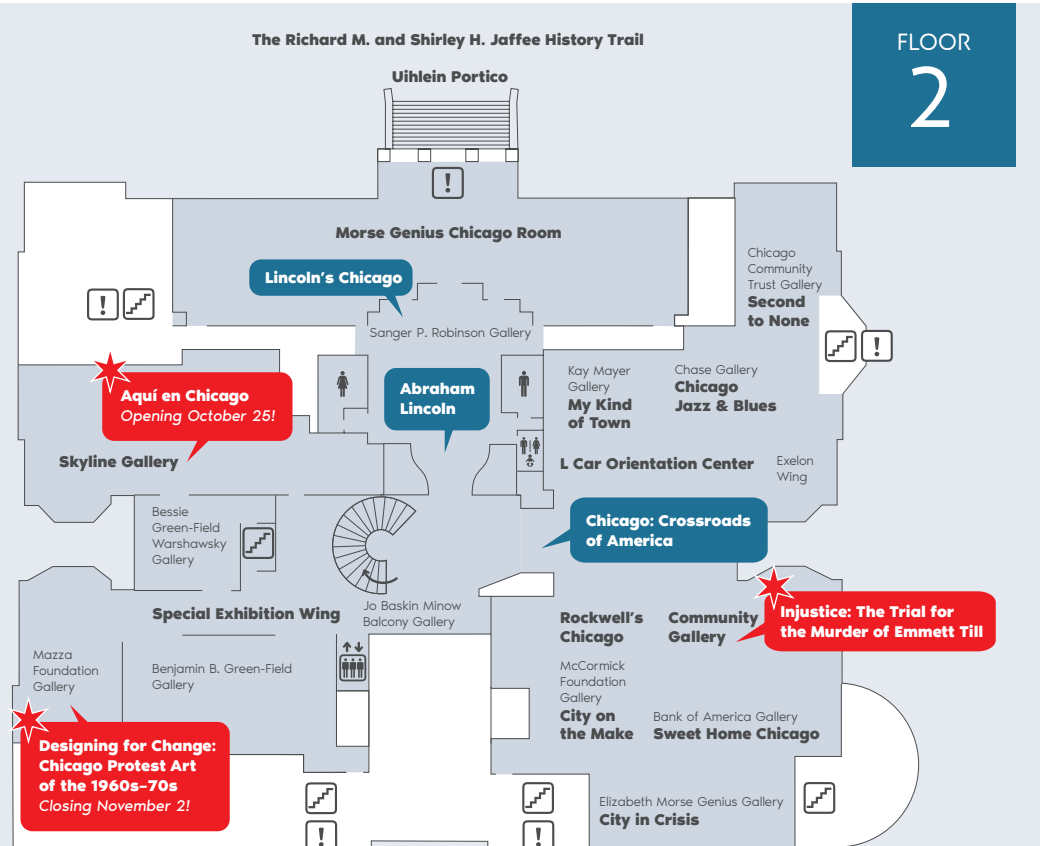
### ★ ROBERT R. MCCORMICK THEATER
