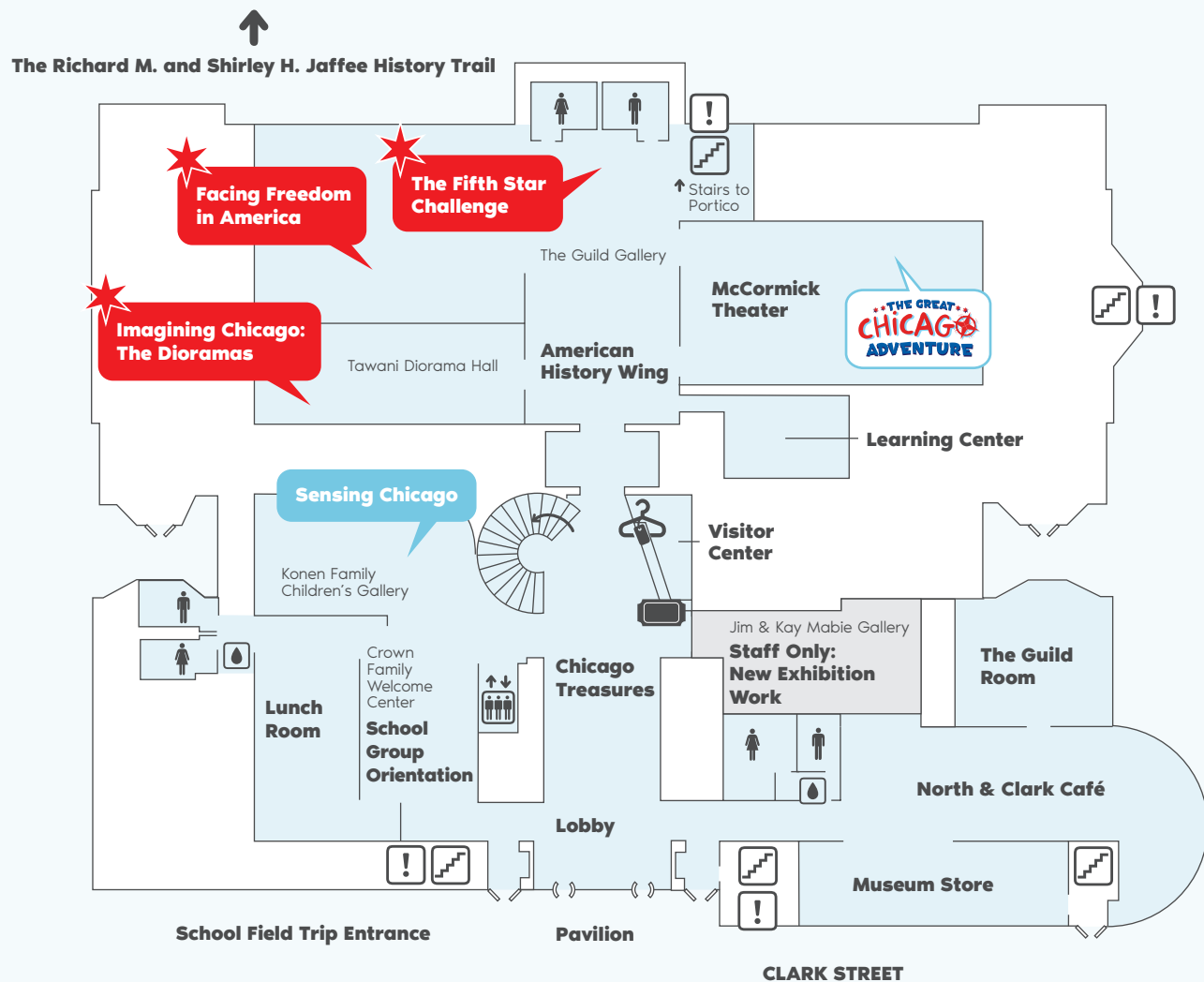

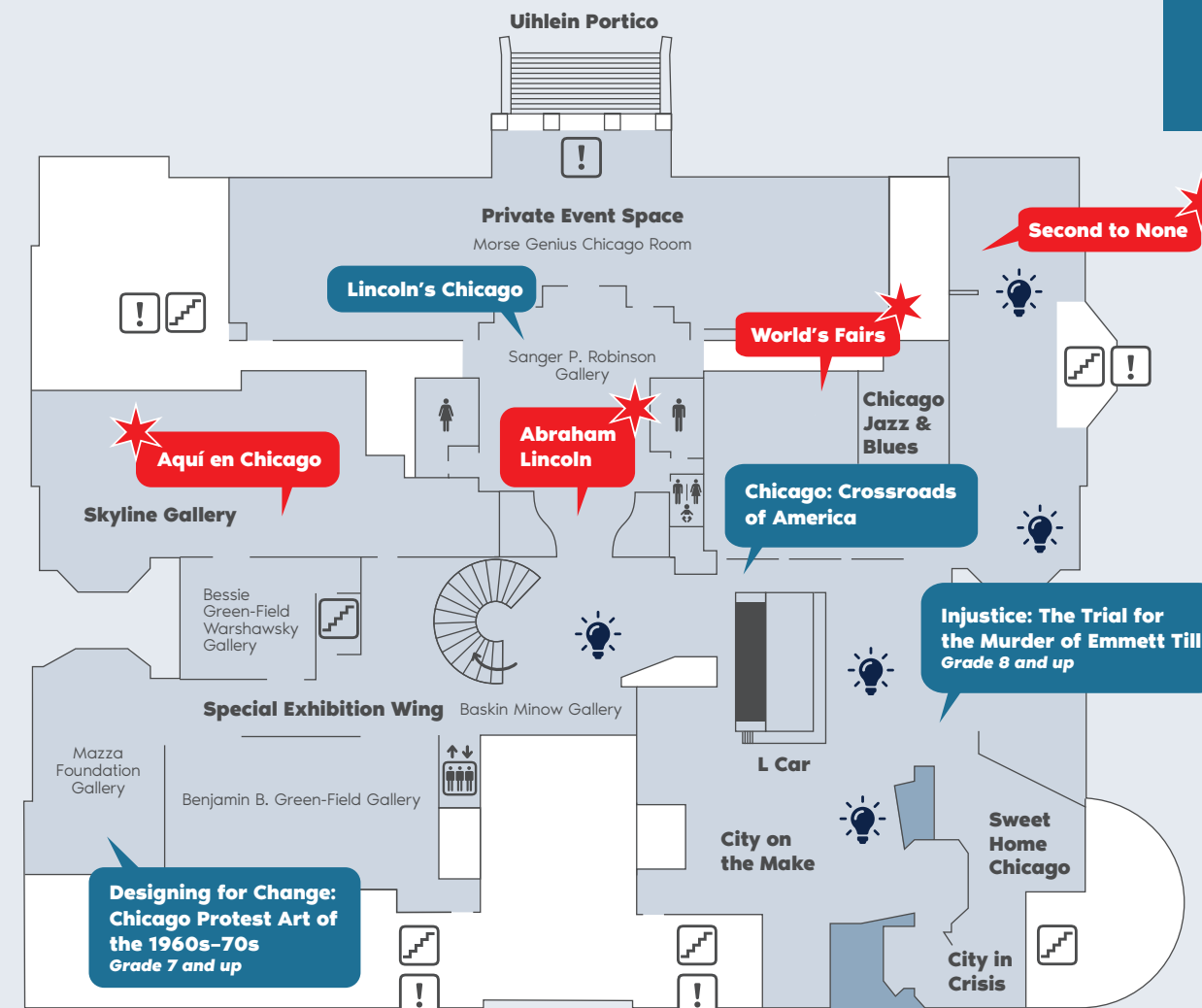


Aquí en Chicago traces the lives of Latino/a/e communities that have maintained a persistent cultural presence and flourished in Chicago and the surrounding suburbs.

IDEA STATIONS

💡 RUBBLE TO RECOVERY

In this board game, take on the role of a family who survived the Great Chicago Fire. Discover how decisions, city policies, and chance impact your recovery following the blaze.

💡 JOURNEY TO CHICAGO

In this game, discuss together the historical experiences of people immigrating and migrating to Chicago.

💡 ARTIFACTS

Explore objects through touch and discussion, then bring an adjective into the gallery and choose an artifact that matches it.

💡 COMMUNITY MATTERS

This card game challenges students to earn enough points to complete a community project. But watch out! Government policies, funding, and community engagement all impact the outcome.

💡 BRIDGES

Create, construct, and test bridges to discover how they work and why they are so important in Chicago's history.
