See how Chicago activists in the 1960s and '70s used design to amplify their visions of a more just world and to fight for social change.

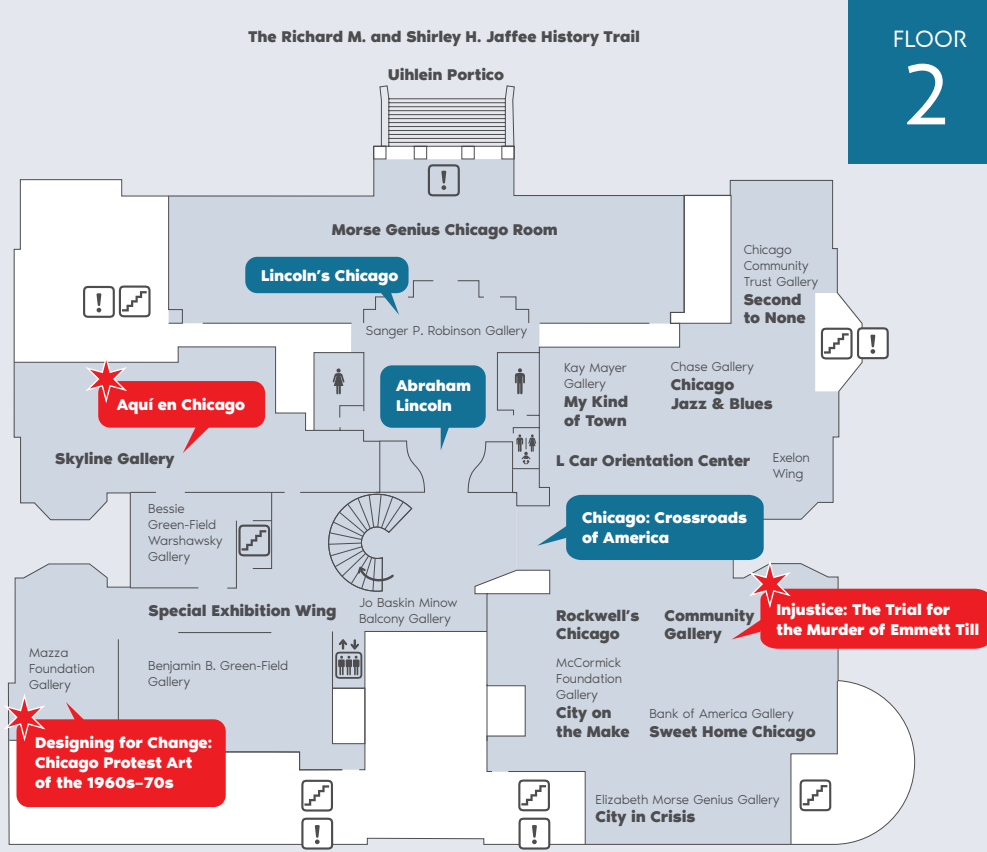
## ★ INJUSTICE: THE TRIAL FOR THE MURDER OF EMMETT TILL

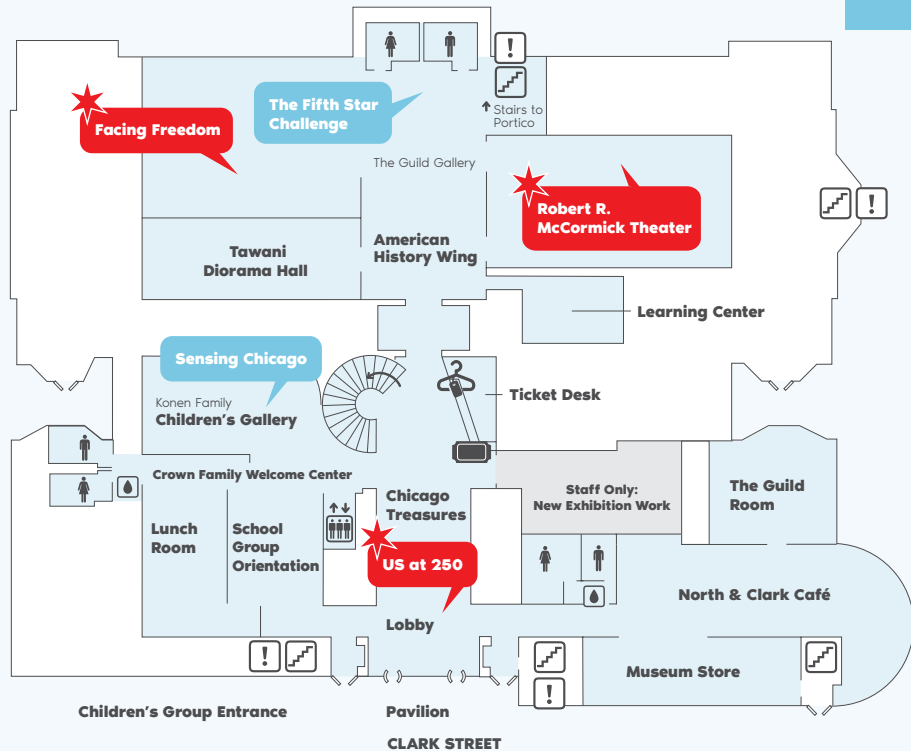
## ★ FACING FREEDOM
