

Project Allowances



Each participating school may submit the following number of projects to compete at the CMHF regional contests (see the [dates and deadlines](#) for your division here). Junior and Senior division contests are held separately until the State and National levels.

Schools are responsible for selecting which projects will compete at the regional contests. CMHF recommends that schools hold a class-wide or school-wide History Fair event to select the advancing projects.

Project Allowances

SENIOR DIVISION:

- 8 research papers
- 8 exhibits
- 8 performances or documentaries
- 8 websites

You may trade slots, with there being no more than 12 in any category*

JUNIOR DIVISION:

- 4 research papers
- 4 exhibits
- 3 performances or documentaries
- 3 websites

You may trade slots, with there being no more than 8 in any category*

**Schools (in either division) with 140+ projects may add one entry (any category) per every 50 projects. For example, 140 projects = one additional entry in any category; 190 projects = two additional entries.*

Selecting Projects for Regional Contests

Participating teachers are responsible for selecting which projects will advance to compete at the regional contests. We encourage you to hold class-wide and/or [school-wide History Fair events](#) for students to showcase their work and select the projects that will advance. How you make the selection is up to you, and may be based on judge rankings, classroom grades, or other considerations. A school Fair is also a good opportunity to demonstrate the value of History Fair to your colleagues and administrators.

You will need to make your selections before the CMHF Registration Due Date for your division. All projects competing at CMHF Regional Contests must be registered before the due date. Be sure to leave enough time after selecting your projects to complete the registration spreadsheet before the due date.
